

SQUAW VALLEY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT FIRE SAFETY DAY

DESCRIPTION: Residents of Squaw Valley are invited to bring their inert, natural yard wastes to a central collection site for free removal. The event is geared toward helping residents comply with defensible space requirements and to aid in the diversion of recyclable materials from the solid waste stream.

TIME: Saturday, June 27th, 2009; 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

LOCATION: Squaw Valley Public Service District parking area, 305 Squaw Valley Rd.

LIMITATIONS:

- a) Squaw Valley residents only; no commercial customers please.
- b) No garbage will be accepted.
- c) Natural woody debris only: tree limbs, brush, yard trimmings, pine needles, dead leaves, dry grass;
- d) Debris should be no more than 4 feet in length; stems should be no more than 4 inches in diameter;
- e) No stumps, construction debris, nails, dirt (including sod), rocks, or garbage (including bags);
- f) Items should be grouped as follows:
 1. Tree limbs and brush;
 2. Pine needles;
 3. Other material including dry grass and dead leaves;
- g) Grass clippings must be dry (not green or wet).
- h) Items carried to site in a container (cans, bags, boxes, etc.) must be emptied and removed by the customer; there will be no provision for garbage.
- i) Limit of 3 yards (approx. 20 bags) per trip;
- j) Proof of residency/ property ownership may be required.
- k) ABSOLUTELY NO HOT ASHES.

REMINDER OF PUBLIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Comply with above limitations.
- First come first serve. All sites will be monitored; someone will assist in dumping and checking loads. Public is expected to wait turn in any line.
- No dumping or leaving material unless assisted by TTSD personnel.
- Park responsibly so as not to impede traffic or endanger others.
- Cover loads when travelling to collection point.
- Collection will end promptly at 2:30 p.m.; public should coordinate arrival time accordingly.
- No wastes should be left at the collection site following the event.
- SUGGESTION: Lining trucks with a tarp prior to loading will facilitate off-loading.
