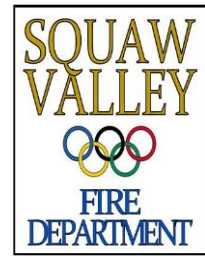




# Notice

## Squaw Valley Public Service District Customers Stage II Water Conservation



The California Department of Water Resources approved an emergency regulation to ensure water conservation on July 29, 2014 pursuant to Sections 11346.1 and 11349.6 of the Government Code. In response to the mandatory drought regulation the Squaw Valley Public Service District is implementing District Water Code Section 3.23.3 **Stage II Water Conservation Restrictions**. In addition to restrictions contained in Stage I (normal conditions) the following restrictions are effective immediately:

- a. *Filling of swimming pools is prohibited if uncovered while not in use.*
- b. *Use of an ornamental fountain or similar water feature is prohibited, unless a water recycling system is used and public notice about the use of the system is prominently displayed.*
- c. *Outdoor irrigation of all vegetation, including lawns and landscaping, is limited to three times per week, one hour per irrigation zone, per day. No irrigation, for any purpose other than fire safety measures is allowed on Mondays. Properties with street addresses ending with even numbers may irrigate on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. Properties with street addresses ending with odd numbers may irrigate on Wednesdays, Fridays and Sundays. Hand watering is permitted at will. No irrigation is permitted from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.*
- d. *Installation of new landscaping is prohibited.*
- e. *Hardscapes. Water shall not be used to wash sidewalks, driveways, parking areas, tennis courts, decks, patios or other improved areas, unless required for driveway repair or maintenance, or for immediate fire, sanitation, or health hazards.*
- f. *Fire Hydrants. Use of fire hydrants for flushing (except for protection of public health), water for compaction, and dust control must be coordinated with hydrant flushing.*
- g. *Lodging Facilities. Lodging facilities must post water conservation literature in each room. Literature must be approved by the General Manager.*
- h. *Stage II declaration and restrictions will be reviewed every 180 days by the Board of Directors. When Stage II restrictions are removed, Stage 1 (Normal Conditions) provisions will be re-instated.*
- i. *Water use restrictions will remain in effect until the Board of Directors removes the restrictions.*
- j. *If a customer continues to violate the restrictions, a District representative may disconnect water service to the customer or reduce water service for household purposes only. Disconnected or reduced service will be restored after payment for reconnection.*
